



Policy for District Deputies

Purpose: The purpose of this policy is to define the manner and ways that a District Deputy can present himself at a Council Meeting in which the District Deputy is a Council member.

1. By definition, the District Deputy is a representative of the Supreme Knight and the State Deputy. When the District Deputy attends any council meeting or function, he is there as an observer and representative of the Supreme Knight and the State Deputy. This is to insure that proper protocol is followed. The District Deputy is there to assist any new officer to become familiar with his job responsibilities for the position elected. A District Deputy is responsible for conveying all information from the Supreme Council or the State Council to the Councils in his district. At no time can the District Deputy propose or vote on any resolution(s) brought before the council for a vote. The District Deputy should refrain from interjecting his opinion unless the topic conflicts with the Supreme Council or State Council rules.
2. If for some reason a District Deputy feels his opinion should be heard, then he needs to contact (alert) the Grand Knight in advance of his wish and why. If the Grand knight consents to his wish, the District Deputy should have a surrogate address the Council on his behalf for the topic in question. The purpose for this is to minimize any potential conflict of interest and reduce any thought of bullying due to position.
3. If for some reason the Council seeks his opinion on a subject, the District Deputy should discuss the pros and cons and refrain from giving his opinion on the subject.
